Discussion Prompts

- 1) At the start, some people want the man to go, the fisherman says they should let him stay. Who do you agree with? How would you persuade the Islanders?
- 2) How many of the rumours that spread about the man... how many of them are true? And if they are true why?
- 3) At the end... it says "some people agreed with the fisherman, but the others were louder". Have you ever been part of something that you knew wasn't right... but you took part because that was what your friends were doing... or it was easier to do that because it was easier to stand up for what was right?
- 4) How might you have persuaded the Islanders to let the man stay?
- 5) Is this story about something bigger than just a man and an island? Is it about something that is going on in our world today. If so, what?
